Requirement of Completion: Phlebotomy Technician: Students are required to successfully complete 20 hours of basic didactic, 20 hours of advanced didactic, and 80 hours of practical phlebotomy training including a minimum of 50 patient venipunctures, 10 patient skin punctures, and the observation of at least two arterial punctures pursuant to the California Code of Regulations Title 17, Section 1034(a)(2) with total clock hours of 120. Upon successful completion of the course with the appropriate number of hours required, in addition to a cumulative grade point of B (80%) in the midterm and final exam. Student will be awarded certificate of completion and will be qualified to apply for the CPT certification through CDPH-LFS & National Healthcare Association (NHA). All fees must be paid in full.
